

KNOW YOUR VOTING RIGHTS

VOTE for Sandy Pasch on Tuesday, August 9th

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE on Election Day, Tuesday, August 9th, between 7 a.m. and 8 p.m. *As long as you are in line by 8:00 p.m. you must be allowed to vote.*

NOTE ON NEW VOTER ID LAW

You will be asked to show a photo ID when you vote in-person. However, you **CANNOT** be denied a regular ballot if you do not show a photo ID. **IF YOU ARE DENIED YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE CALL 608-260-2421.**

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE if you have been a resident of a Ward for 28 days before an election.

NOT REGISTERED? YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO REGISTER AT THE POLLS ON ELECTION DAY WITH PROOF OF RESIDENCE:

1. Wisconsin driver's license or state-issued ID card;
2. Other Wisconsin ID or license with photo;
3. Utility bill (including cell phone bills) no more than 60-days old;
4. Property tax bill from 2010 or 2011;
5. Employer ID card (not including a business card);
6. Current residential lease (that includes name of elector);
7. Bank statement;
8. Paycheck; OR
9. Any document issued by a unit of government.

IF YOU HAVE PROBLEMS OR QUESTIONS ABOUT VOTING CALL 608-260-2421.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO SPECIAL ASSISTANCE in the voting booth if English is not your first language, if you cannot read or write, or if you are blind or otherwise disabled.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO RECEIVE ANOTHER BALLOT from election officials if you make a mistake. You may receive up to 3 ballots in total.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE at your vehicle or outside the facility if you are unable to enter the polling place due to a disability.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE without harassment or electioneering. Electioneering is prohibited within 100 feet of a polling place.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE without being challenged without cause.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE without being intimidated by any person.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE during work hours without retaliation by your employer.
